Number of Children to Achieve SM05 Target – **00 Children**



Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.



Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.









Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 65.02%












Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 65.02%










Adoption Finalizations











Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care












Average Cost and Length of Stay for Children by Case Management Organization



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month









HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date









Caseload Variance by Month



Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – **50 Appointments**






