
Number of Children to Achieve SM06 Target - 00 Children

Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.




Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings








Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 68.33%









Exit Interviews Trending by CMO








Adoption Finalizations

Percent of Adoptions Finalized with 24 Months of Removal & Percent of Adoption Goal Met














Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care





Shelter Trending for Circuit 10


Number of Shelters Occurring by Period and Removal County



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month









HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date




