









Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings


Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.





Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 83.77%













Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 83.77%










Adoption Finalizations








Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month










Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date












Concurrent Case Planning

- Concurrent planning is an approach that seeks to eliminate delays in attaining permanent families for children in the foster care system
- Concurrent planning involves considering all reasonable options for permanency at the earliest possible point following a child's entry into foster care & concurrently pursuing those options that will best serve the child's needs.
- It involves a mix of family centered casework & legal strategies aimed at achieving timely reunification, while at the same time establishing a concurrent permanency plan if reunification cannot be accomplished.
- When pursued respectfully & professionally, concurrent planning can enhance child safety, prevent excessive moves while in care, strengthen family relationships, & create a sense of urgency for the parents.



Take the right steps:

- Differential assessment and prognostic case review.
- 2. Full disclosure to all participants in the case planning process.
 - 3. Family search and engagement
 - 4. Family group conferencing
- 5. Parent-child visiting during out-of-home care
 - 6. Setting clear time limits for permanency decisions.
 - 7. Transparent written agreements and documentation
- 8. Committed collaboration between child welfare, the courts, and service providers
 - 9. Focused support for resource families
- 10. Most importantly, the concurrent plan must be actively pursued during the entire life of the case.
