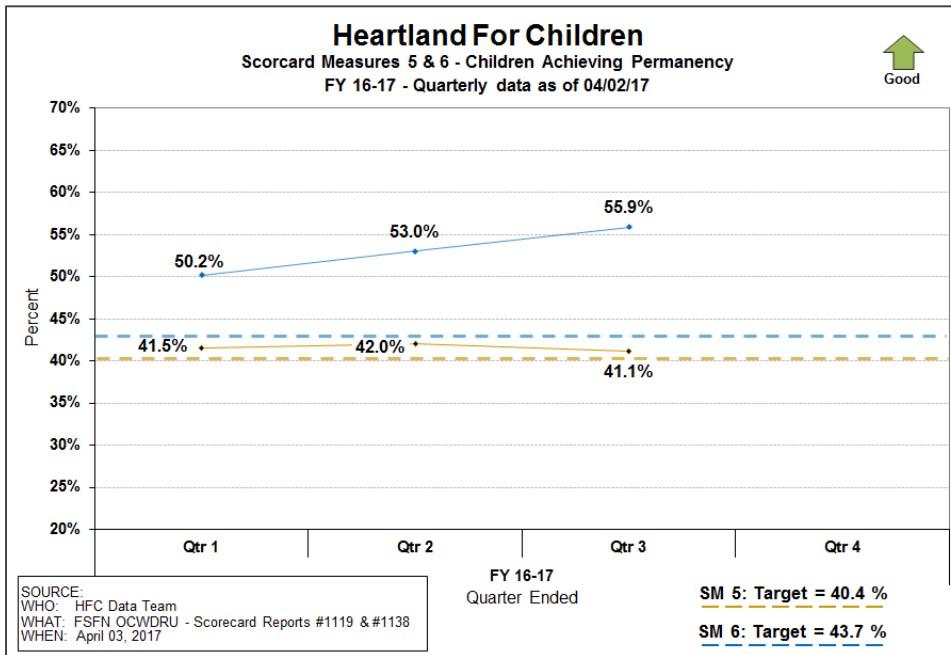

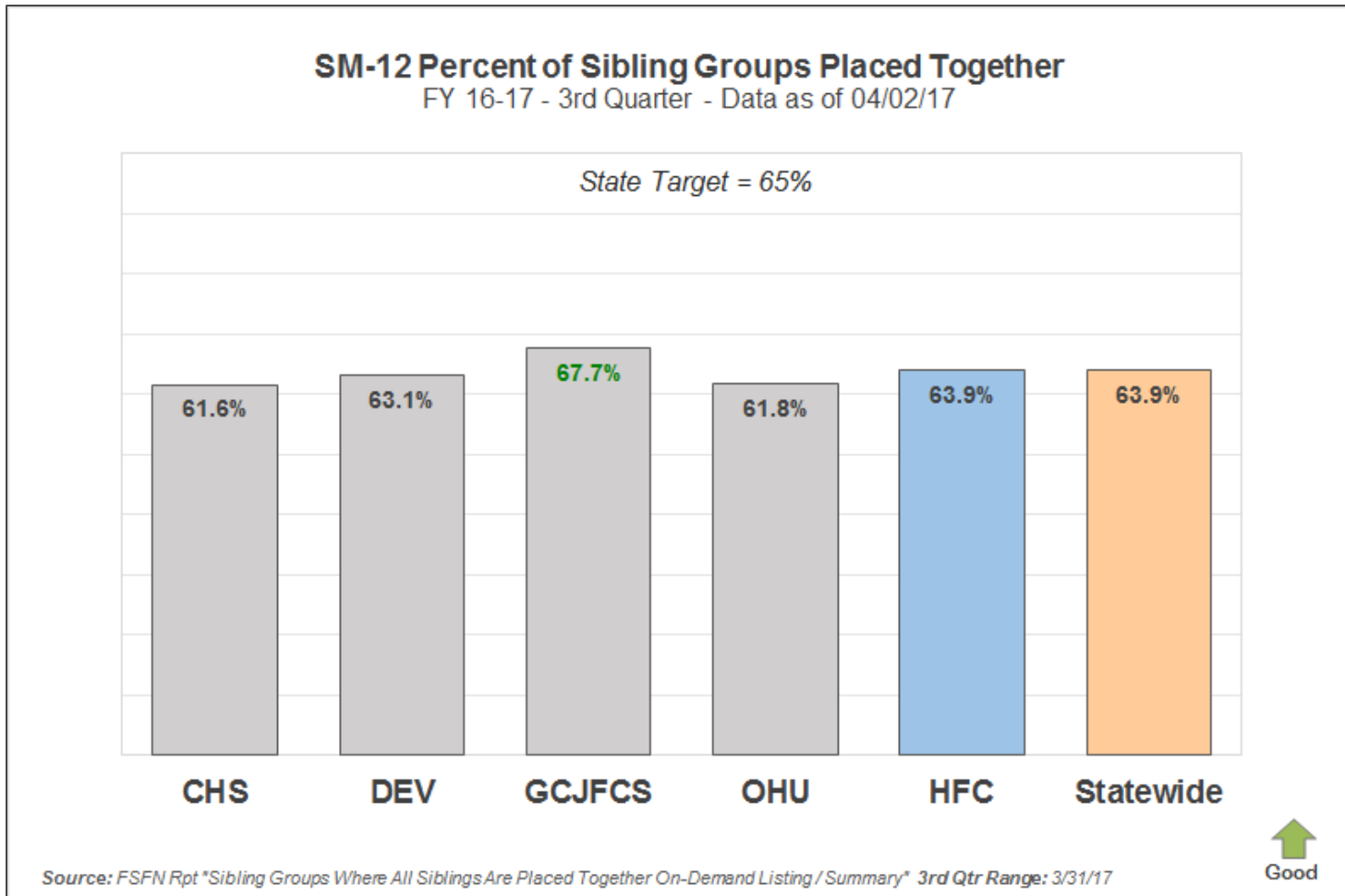

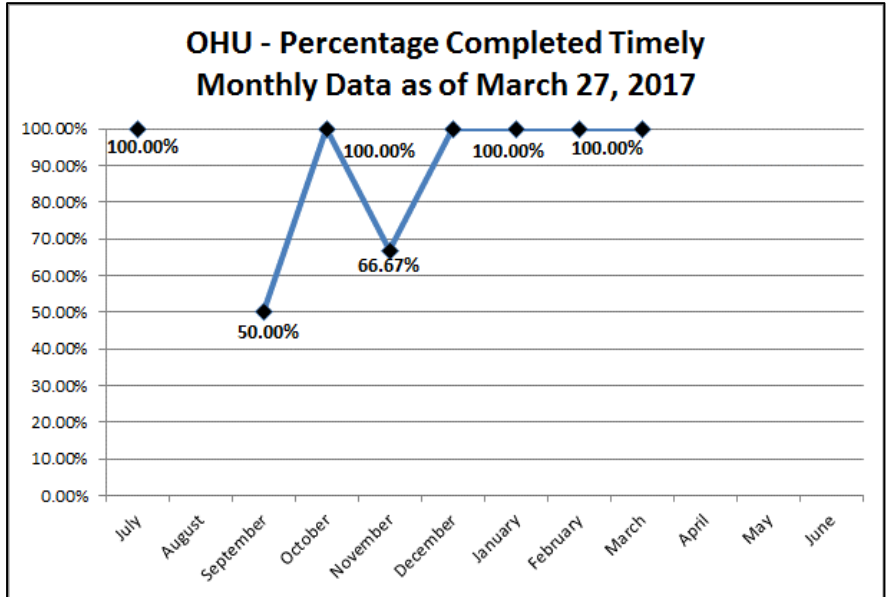
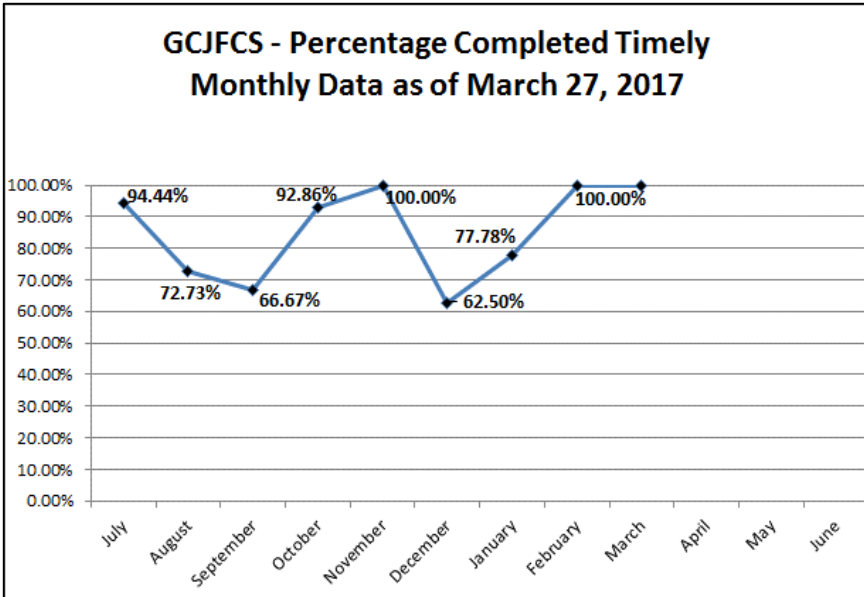
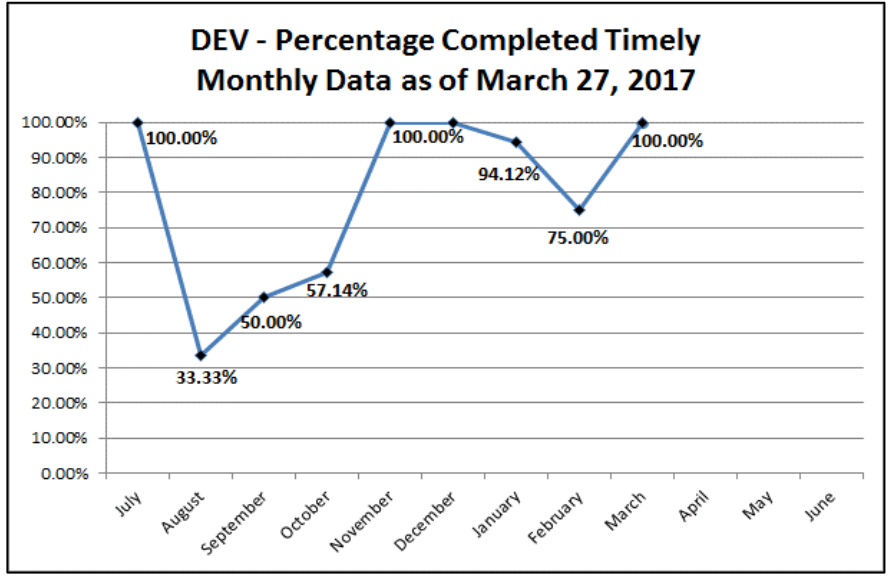
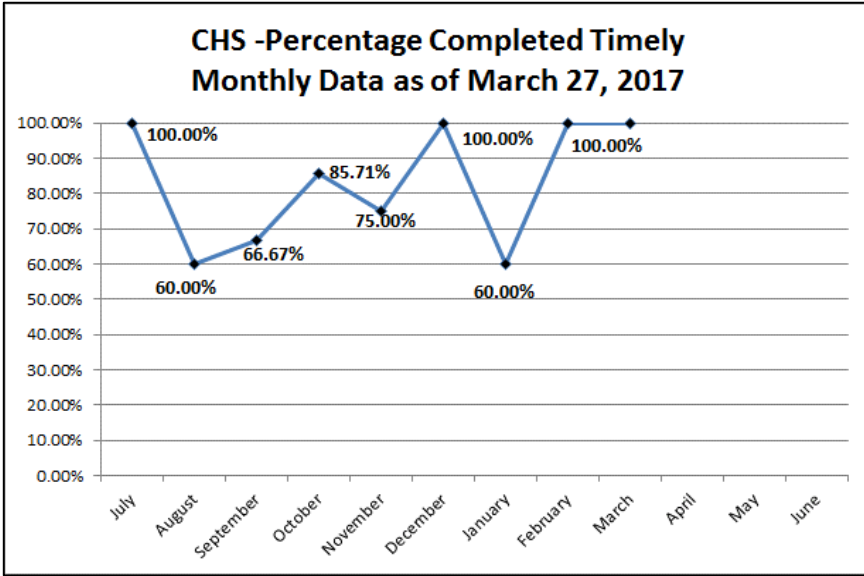
Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings

Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.



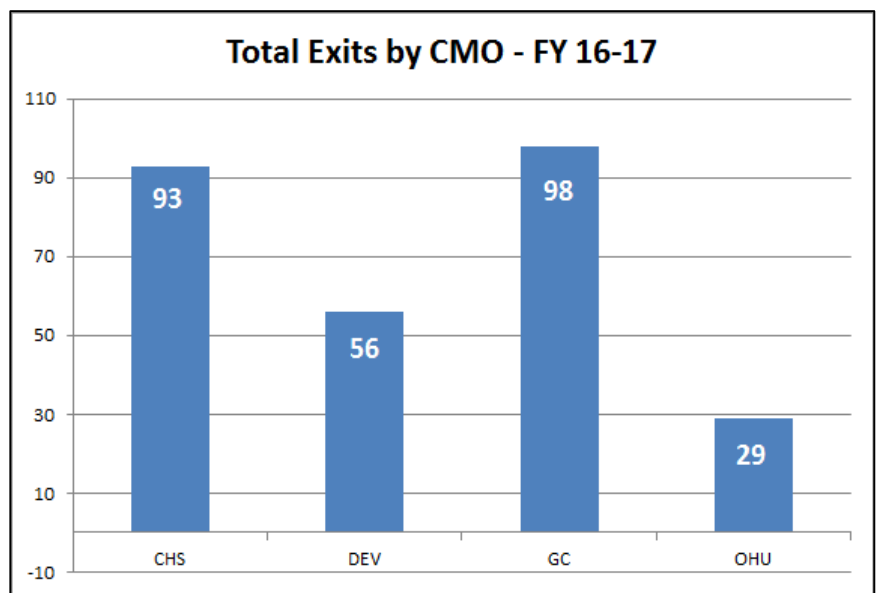
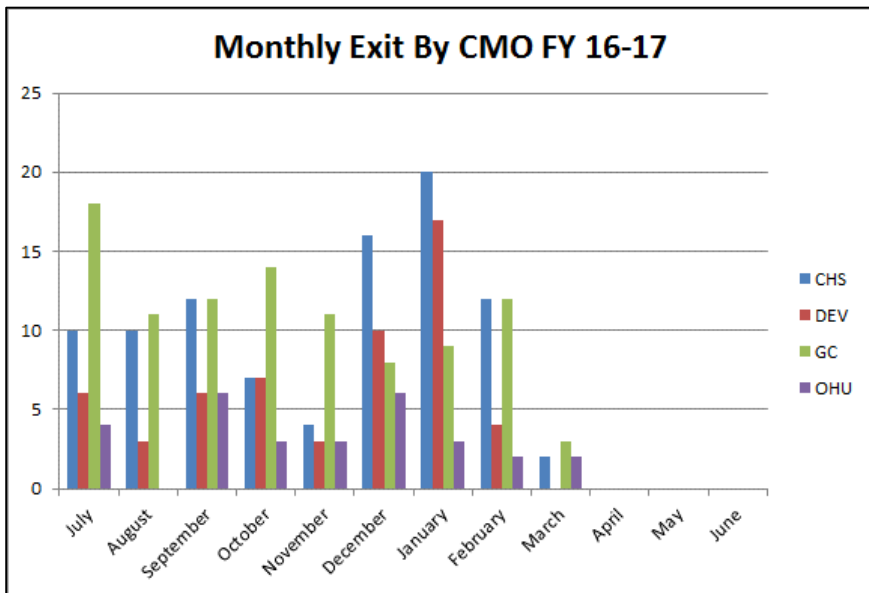
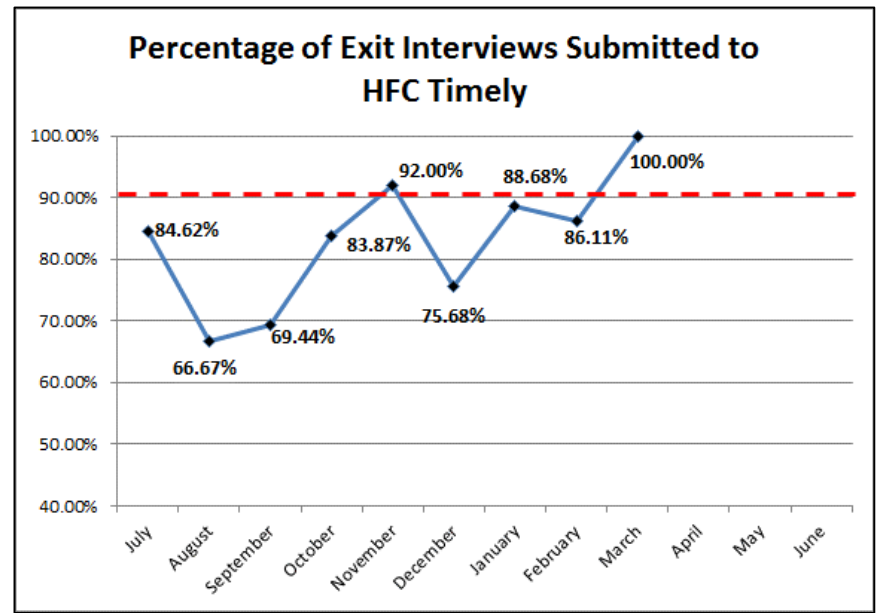
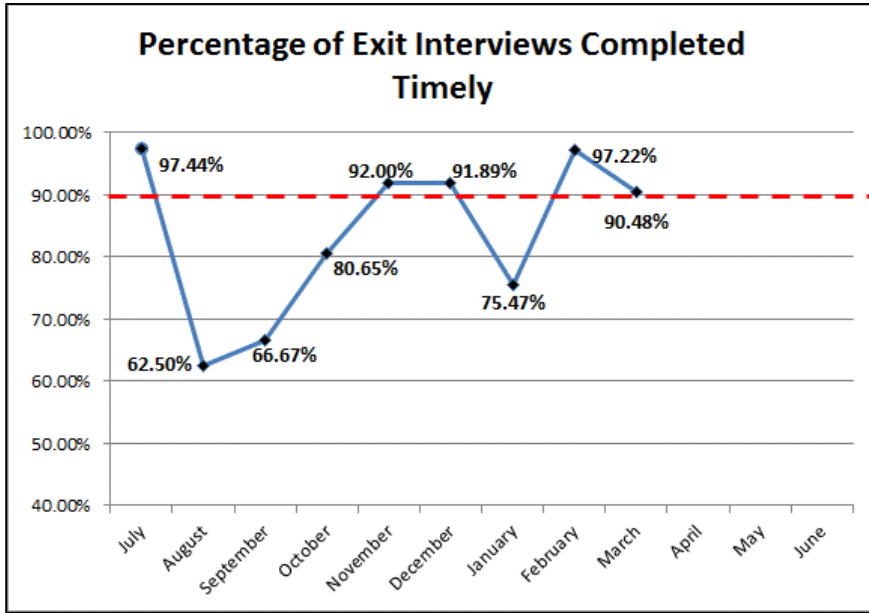
Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 83.77%



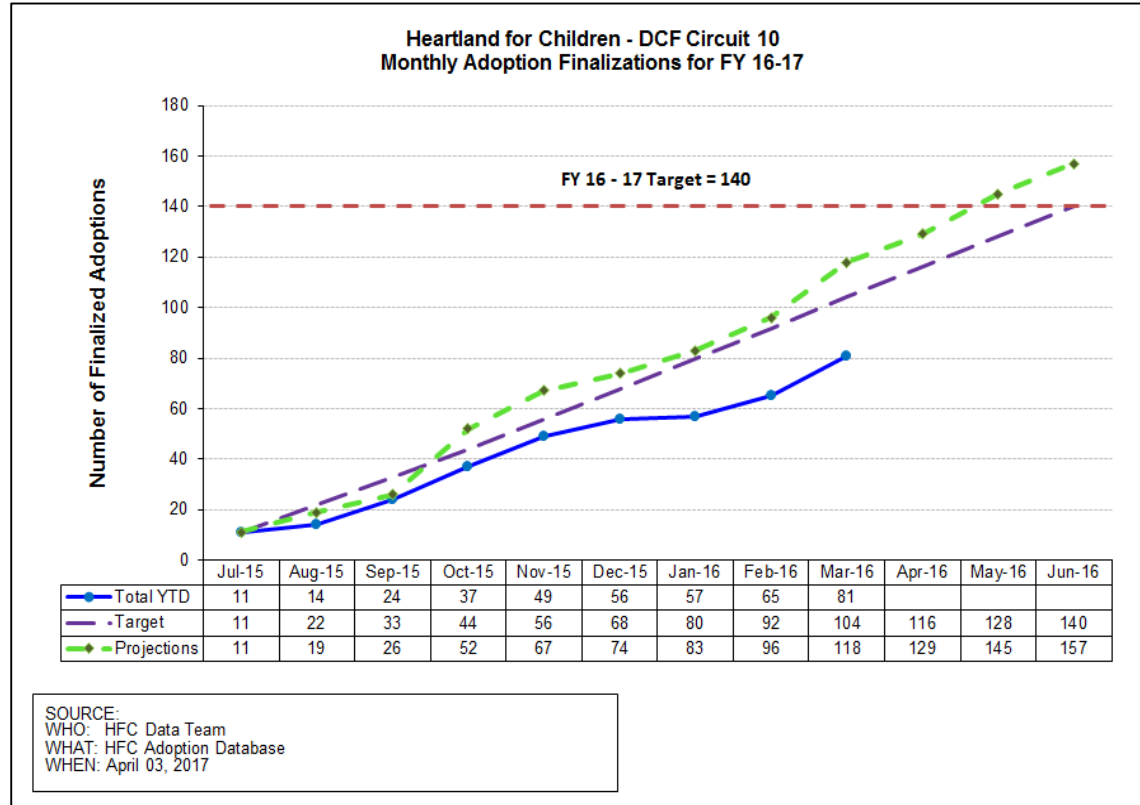
Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

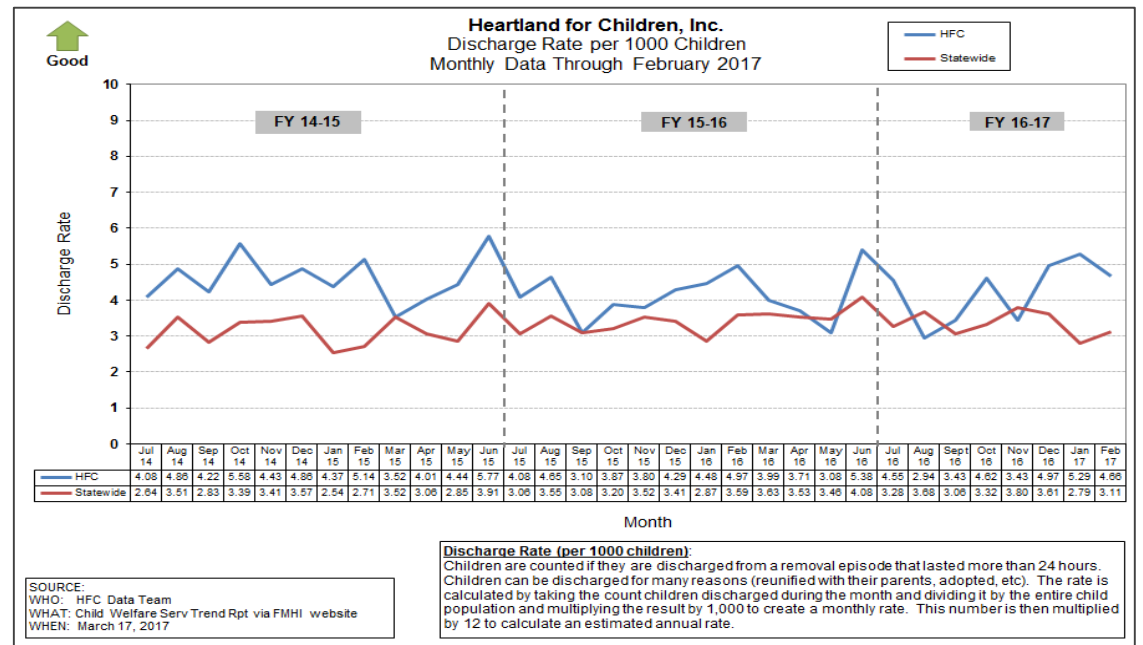
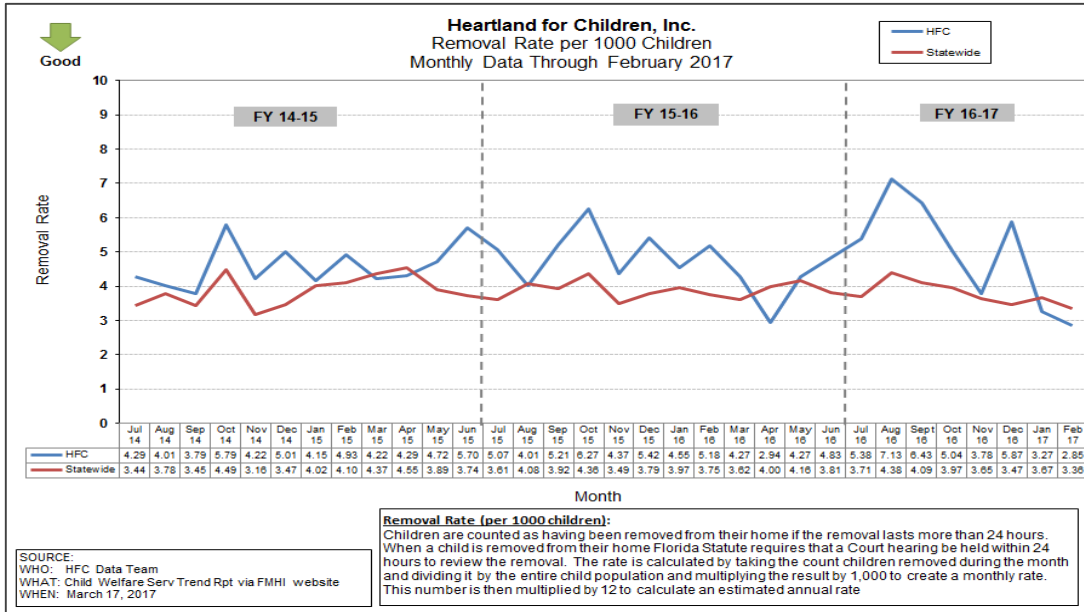

Monthly Removal and Discharge Rates (per 1,000 Children) as of February 2017



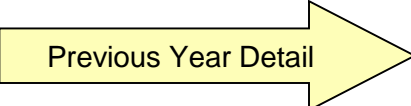

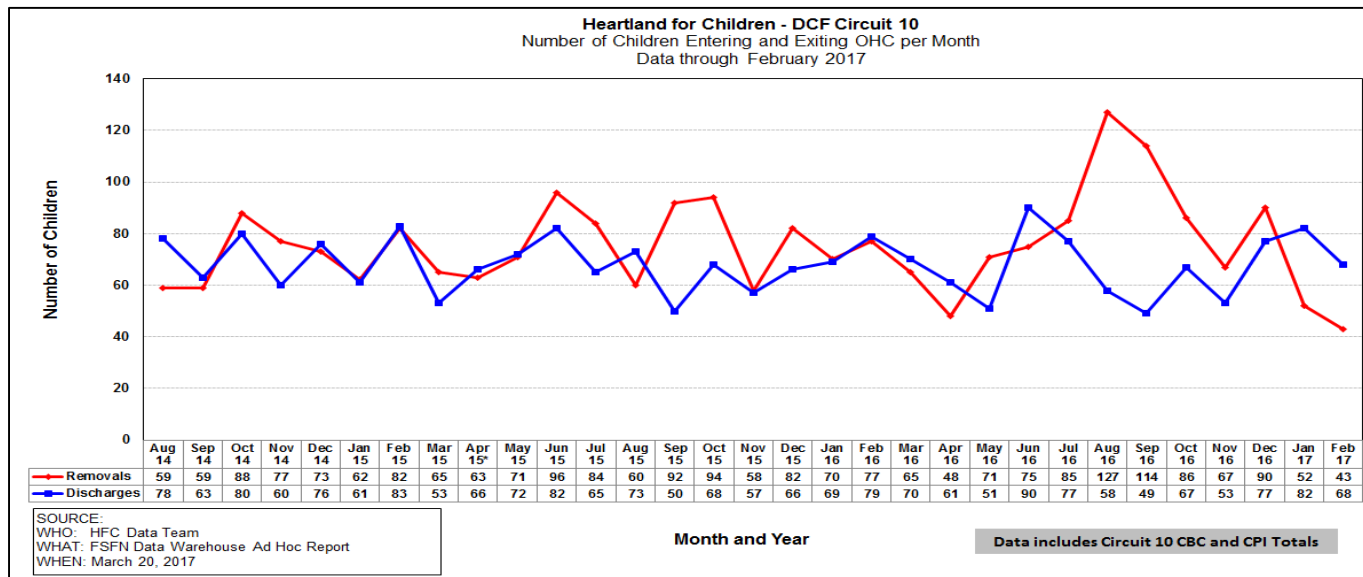

Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month





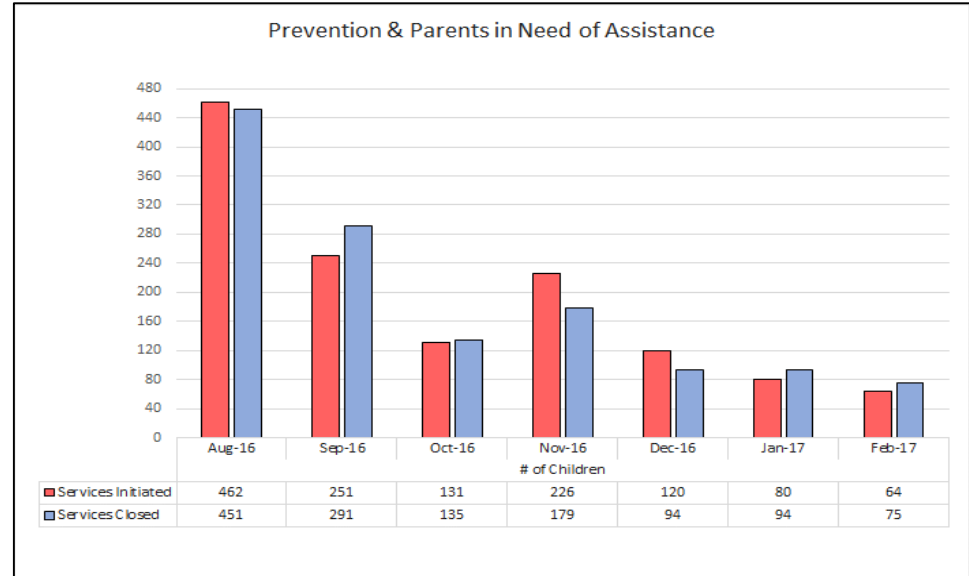
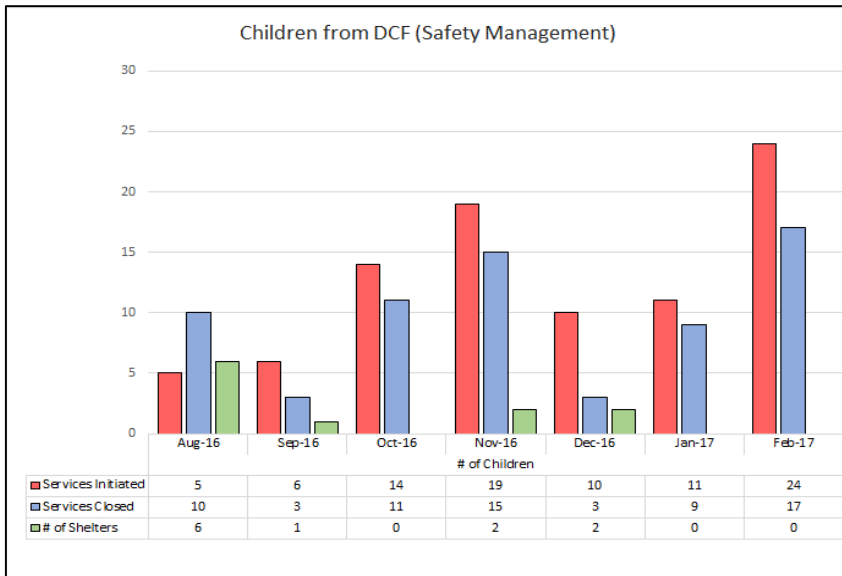
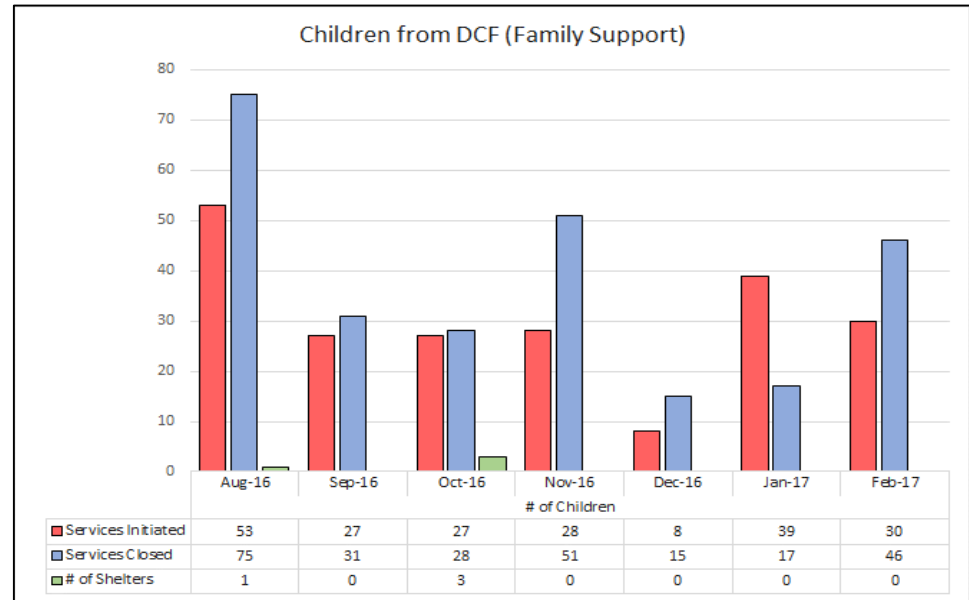
Neighbor to Family – Weekly & Monthly Census

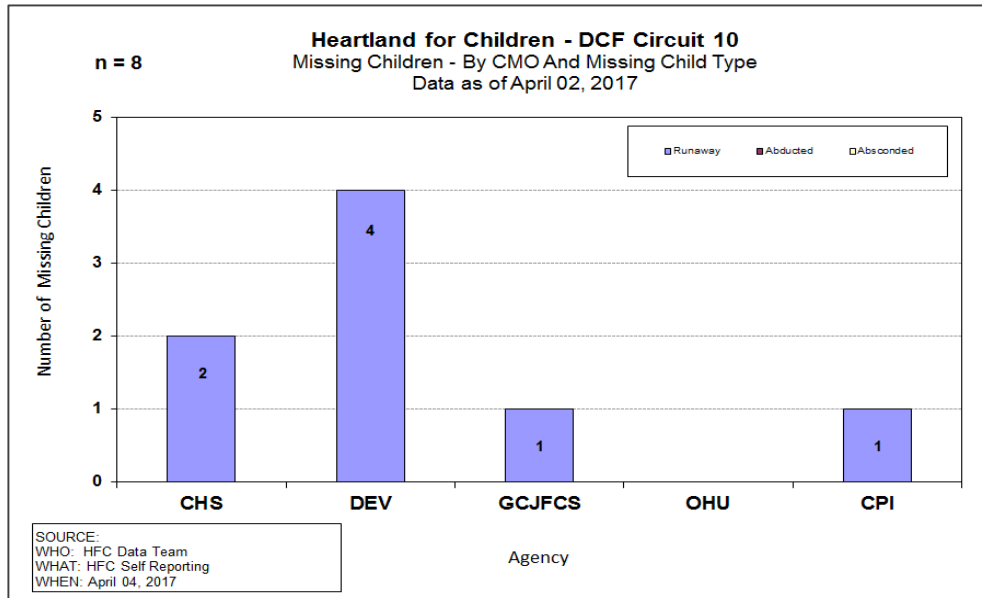

Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date



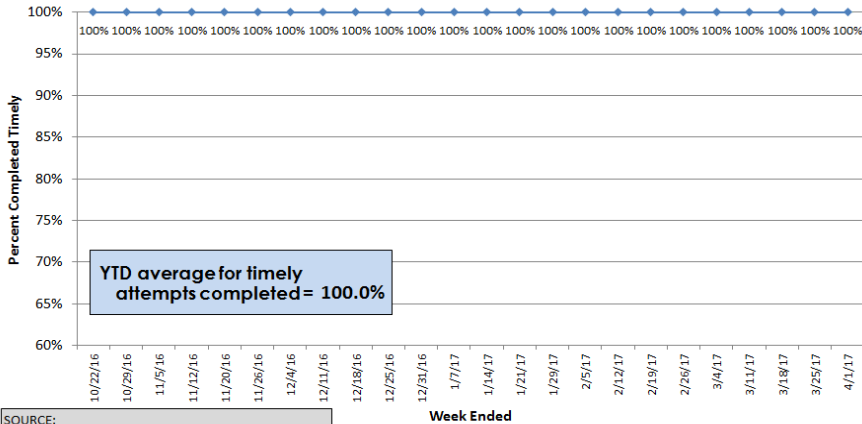

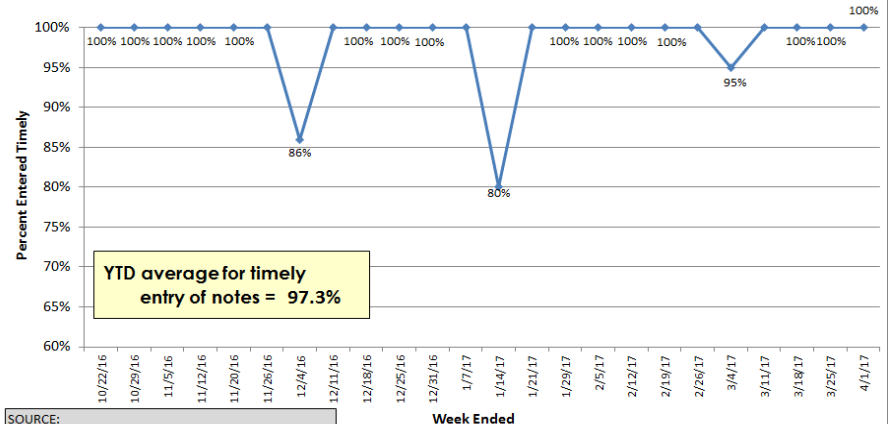

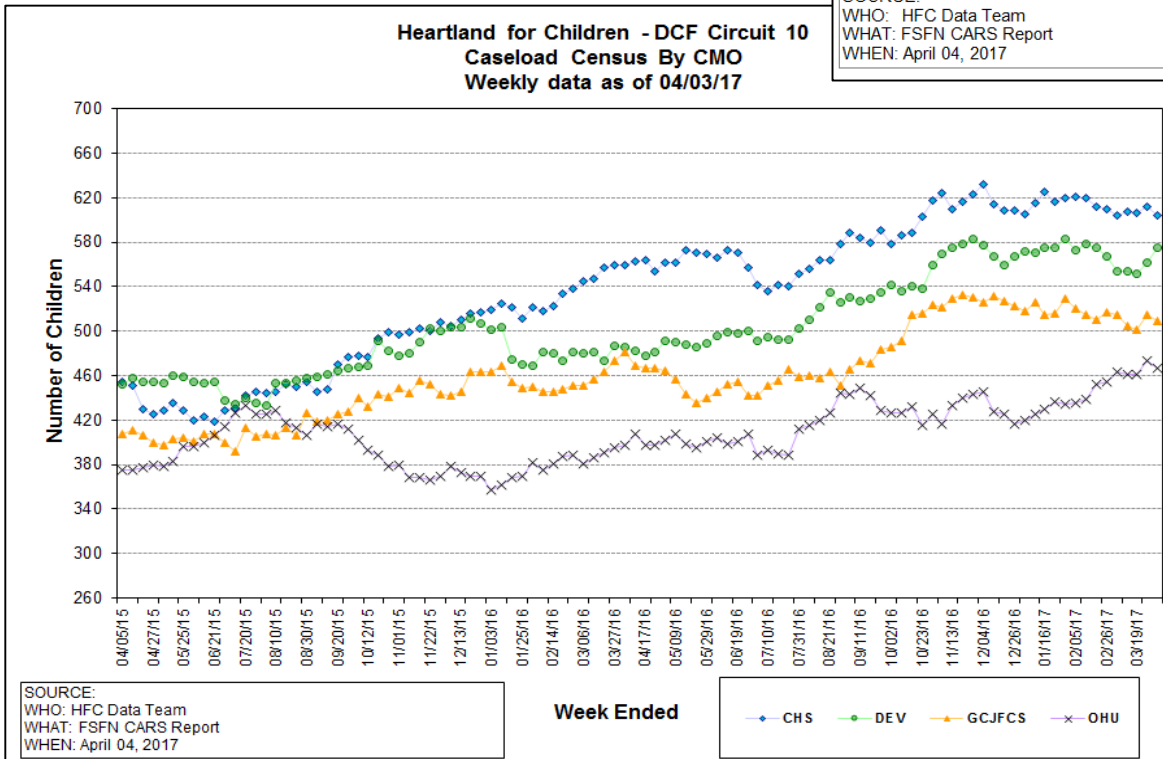

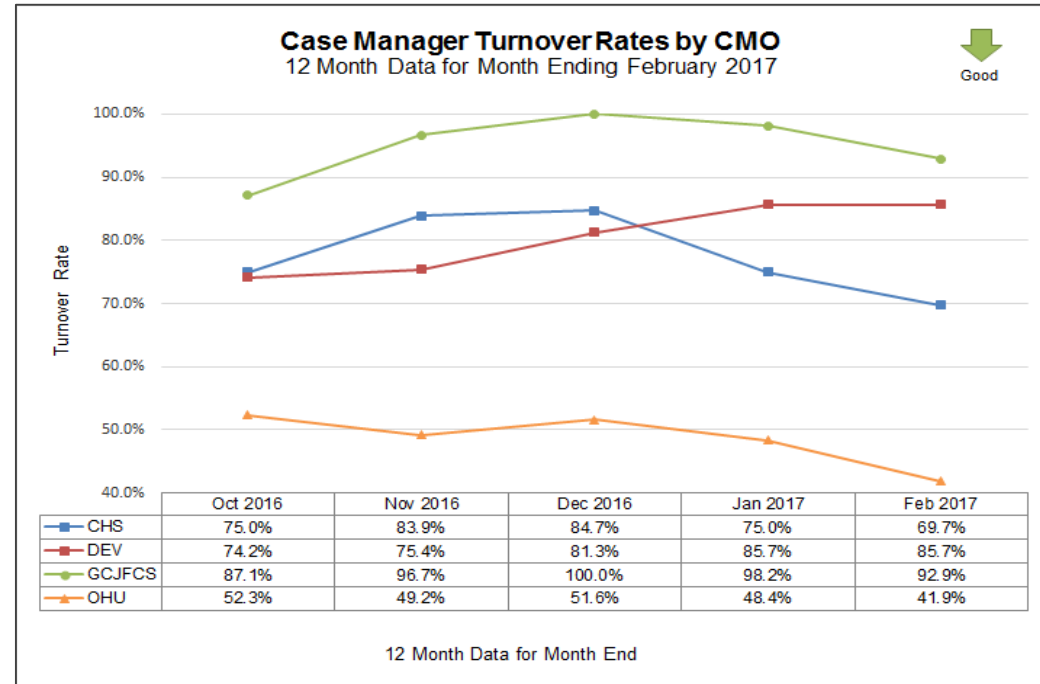

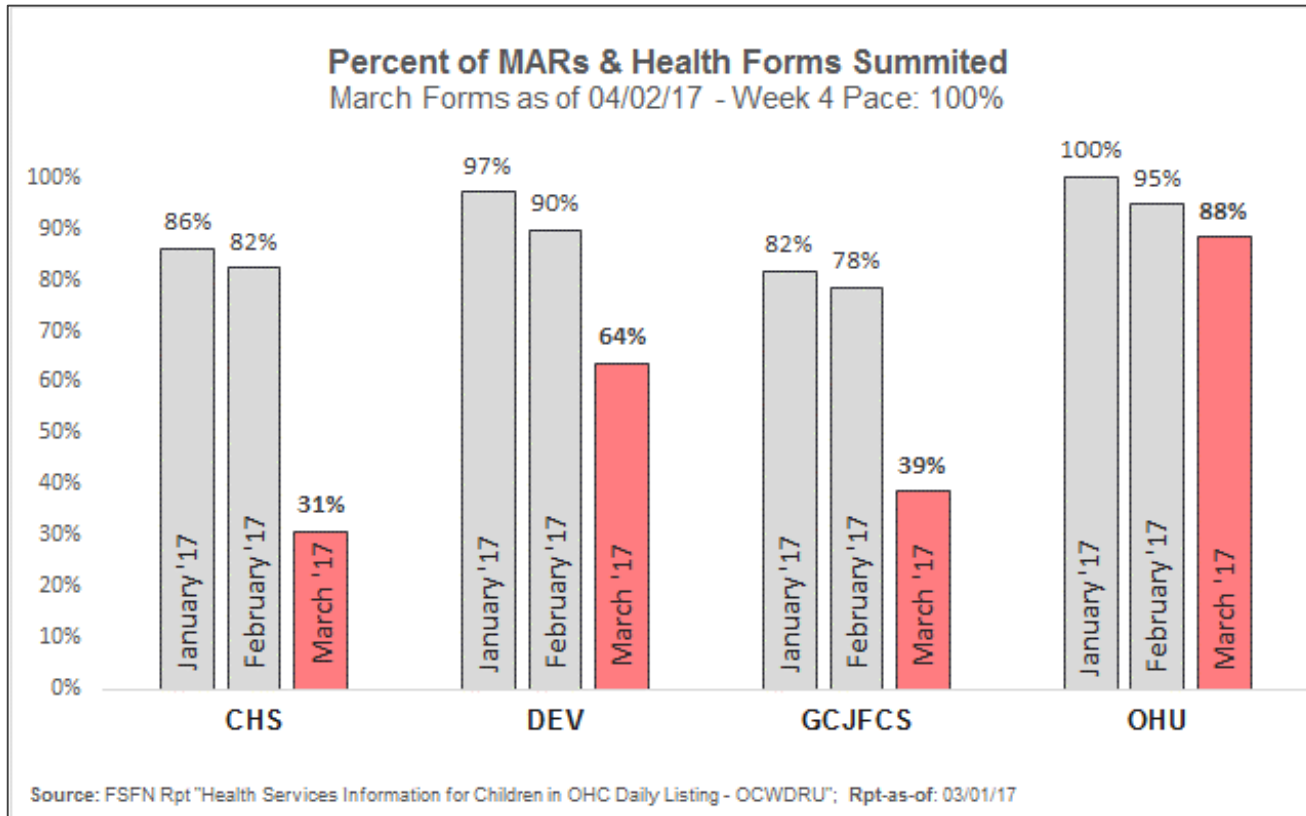

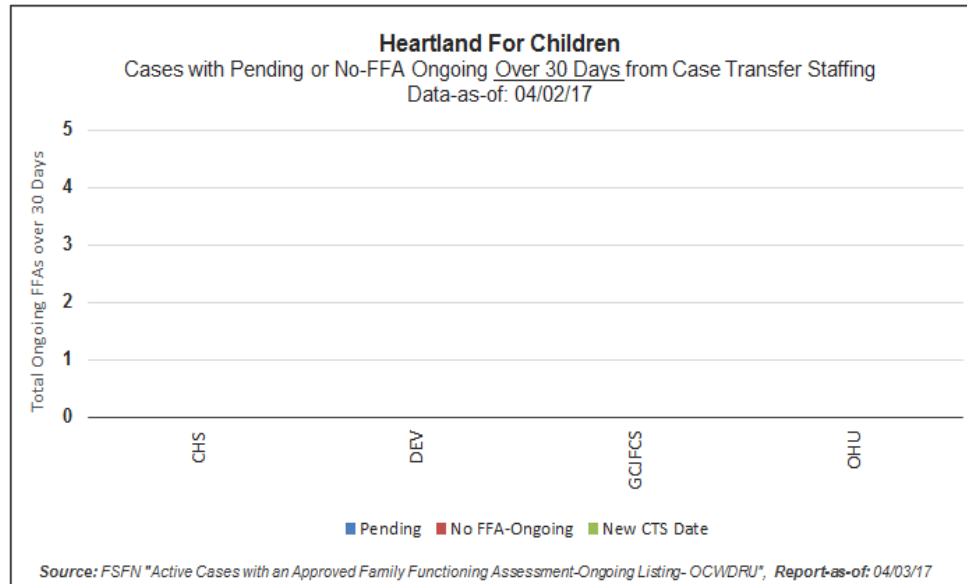

KNOWLEDGE Concurrent Case Planning

- Concurrent planning is an approach that seeks to eliminate delays in attaining permanent families for children in the foster care system
 - Concurrent planning involves considering all reasonable options for permanency at the earliest possible point following a child's entry into foster care & concurrently pursuing those options that will best serve the child's needs.
- It involves a mix of family centered casework & legal strategies aimed at achieving timely reunification, while at the same time establishing a concurrent permanency plan if reunification cannot be accomplished.
 - When pursued respectfully & professionally, concurrent planning can enhance child safety, prevent excessive moves while in care, strengthen family relationships, & create a sense of urgency for the parents.

ACTION

Take the right steps:

1. Differential assessment and prognostic case review.
2. Full disclosure to all participants in the case planning process.
3. Family search and engagement
4. Family group conferencing
5. Parent-child visiting during out-of-home care
6. Setting clear time limits for permanency decisions.
7. Transparent written agreements and documentation
8. Committed collaboration between child welfare, the courts, and service providers
9. Focused support for resource families
10. Most importantly, the concurrent plan must be actively pursued during the entire life of the case.

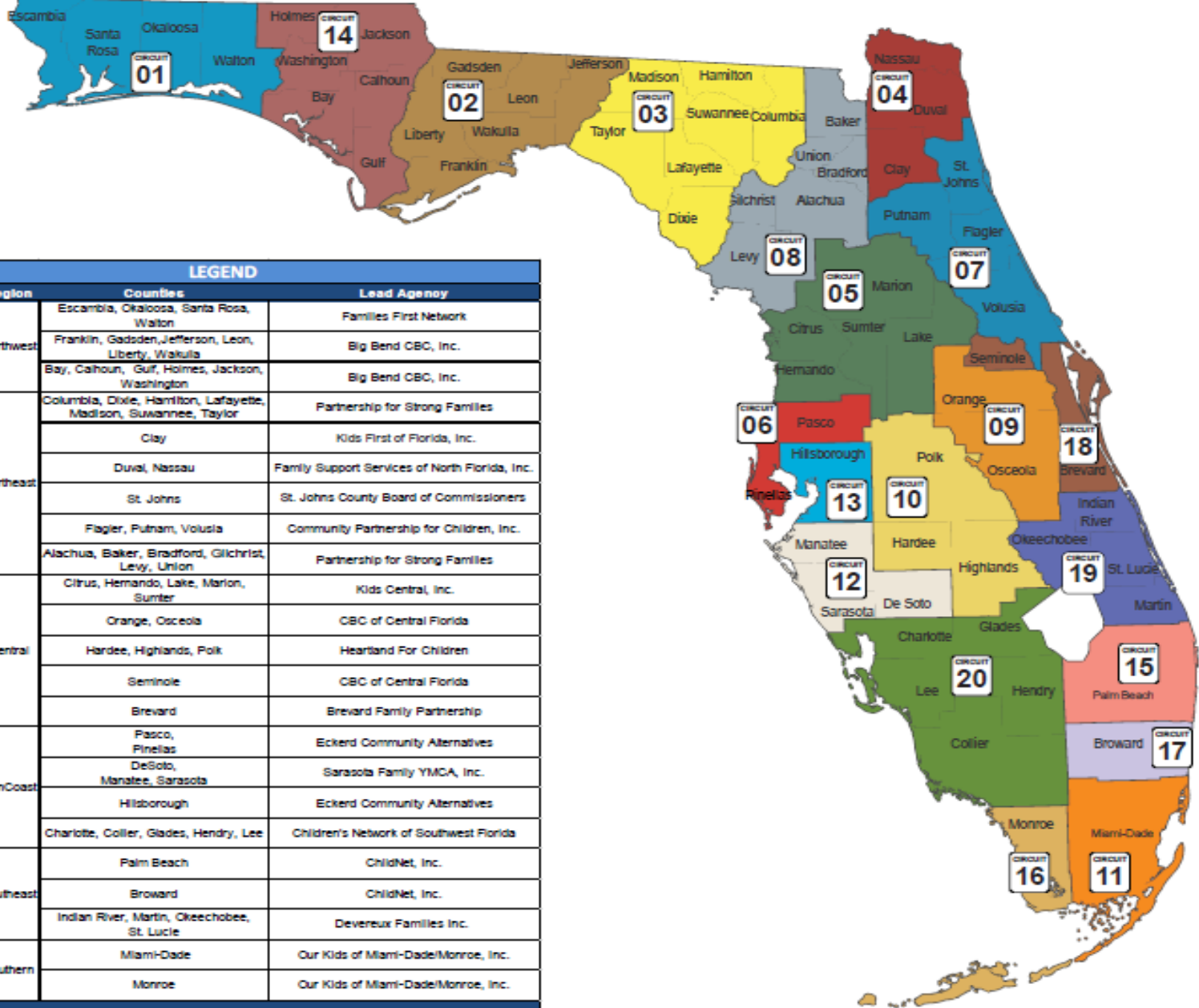
