Number of Children to Achieve SM05 Target - 00 Children



Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.



Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.







HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date








Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – **66 Appointments**






