


Number of sibling groups to Achieve SM12 Target – 13 Sibling Groups








Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – 20 Children





Normalcy - Research shows that normalcy is essential for the social, emotional, and cognitive development of young people. Children in foster care may face many challenges; however, they are entitled to the same opportunities to experience "normal" growing up activities that are typical among their peers who are not in foster care. The "Reasonable and Prudent Parent" standard incorporated in the law allows foster parents to give foster children permission to do daily, age appropriate, activities such as joining a school athletic team, getting a driver's license or going to the beach with friends without the unnecessary involvement of case managers, provider agencies or the court system.
