

Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.



Number of Children in a Removal Episode Who Have Had a Prior Removal





Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.









#### **Exit Interviews Timeliness by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 82.30%












### **Exit Interviews Trending by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 82.30%










#### **Adoption Finalizations**



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month











HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date






