Number of Children to Achieve SM05 Target – 5 Children



Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.



Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.





HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date









Caseload Variance by Month

Number of Children Opening -vs- Closing to Services during Month (as of 06/30/20)














Community Based Care: Hardee, Highlands & Polk Counties
