
Number of Children to Achieve SM06 Target - 0 Children

Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.




Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings




Percent of Adoptions Finalized with 24 Months of Removal & Percent of Adoption Goal Met






Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care





Average Cost and Length of Stay for Children by Case Management Organization









Shelter Trending for Circuit 10 (Year-over-Year)


Rate of Shelters Occurring in Fiscal Year Comparisons

Number of Shelters Occurring by 2-Week Period Trending







Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month











HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date






Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target - 51 Appointments




