

Number of Children in a Removal Episode Who Have Had a Prior Removal














# **Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 76.0%














# **Exit Interviews Trending by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 76.0%













#### **Removal and Discharge Rates**







Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date











Green = Meeting Month Pace, Yellow = 10% Below Month Pace, Red = More Than 10% Below Month Pace




