




Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – 1 Sibling Group







#### **Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care**











#### Average Cost and Length of Stay for Children by Case Management Organization




HFC - DCF Circuit 10 Missing Youth Data as of Reporting Date
















Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – 47 Appointments






