




Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – 3 Sibling Group


Percent of Adoptions Finalized with 24 Months of Removal & Percent of Adoption Goal Met




HFC - DCF Circuit 10 Missing Youth Data as of Reporting Date














Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – 42 Appointments




