

Number of Children in a Removal Episode Who Have Had a Prior Removal



Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings


Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month









Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date









I felt so uncomfortable that I just wanted the visits to end. I also felt as if I'd lost my son's love. He seemed scared of me. He would hesitate to hug me, or stay quiet, barely looking my way. I tried to imagine what was going through his little mind, asking myself, "Is my son rejecting me because he hates me? Does he think I'm a stranger?" I also blamed the agency and the foster mother for the change in my son. For so long at visits, I was so upset and angry that I found it hard to even try to engage my son.
