




Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – **18 Sibling Groups**



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month








Neighbor to Family – Weekly & Monthly Census


HFC - DCF Circuit 10 Missing Youth Data as of Reporting Date














