







Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care











Length of Stay for Children by Case Management Organization



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month










HFC - DCF Circuit 10 Missing Youth Data as of Reporting Date

















Caseload Variance by Month


