As 2025 begins, I want to thank you for being amazing foster caregivers.



HFC's Recruitment Goal for January -June 2025

Our goal for this fiscal year is to license 70 new families and we are only about 25% of the way. The number of referrals that come in January, February, and March will be a major determining factor of our ability to meet that goal.

Our Recruitment team is working with schools, businesses, churches and civic groups to get the word out about fostering through presentations, posters, brochures, and signs. They are also setting up advertisements and posts on social media.

Teachable Moments: Setting Goals

IA new year brings a fresh start and a vision of all the possibilities that the future can hold! That's why New Year's Resolutions are very popular AND that makes this a great time to talk with children and teens about goal setting.

Goal setting is an important life skill that can

- Give them a sense of purpose and responsibility
- Improve their confidence and self-esteem
- Fosters their resilience
- · Helps them focus on what is important
- Enhances critical thinking skills

Here are some quick tips for teaching your children and teens about goal setting.

- Don't start by asking them to set a goal for themselves. Keep conversations emotionally safe by focusing on family goals.
- Look online for age-appropriate tools, templates and resources. Find something that can be customized for each child and teen in your home. For example: One might enjoy creating a vision board while another might prefer using a treasure map (that maps out goals and steps to achieve).
- Find ways to incorporate the terminology into everyday conversation. Ask if something is realistic or when does this need to be done?
- Keep it fun.
- Ask for their opinion. (Don't forget to thank them for it.)
- Start small like tomorrow's to-do list. Oops! I mean: tomorrow's goal list.
- Keep it positive and be supportive when things do go as planned. "I know we didn't get everything done as planned, but we still accomplished a lot!"

Resource: Clothes Closet at First United Methodist Church

First United Methodist Church of Lakeland has a wonderful clothes closet that they have had for many years. The church owns a house on their property that is full of donated clothes that has been neatly organized by size and gender, all intended for children in care and on case plans. Only case managers are allowed to put in requests and come to the house to pick up clothes for children on their caseload. Pick up is Monday 1-4p and Wednesday 9:30a-1p. They even have plenty of school uniforms available!

Foster parents, if you would like some clothes or school uniforms for your foster kiddos, let your case manager know so that they can put in a request!

Provider Spotlight: Worthy & Known



Happy New Year to our Heartland families! The Worthy & Known Family Project is grateful to partner with Heartland for Children. Our mission is for everyone to grow up knowing their God-given dignity and worth. We facilitate both online and in person classes that help our community understand the needs and the why behind

behaviors. Our goal is to have a trauma informed community so that we can be in healthy relationships with one another. We have several opportunities for you to jump in and learn more about how the brain and body works when faced with adversity or hard times.

- -<u>Trust Based Relational Intervention -(TBRI)</u> is a therapeutic model that helps caregivers support children and youth who have experienced trauma or adversity. We offer weekly classes on Thursday's that last 2 hours each for 4 weeks. We have morning or evening available. Next class starts January 9th, 2025.
- -Making Sense of Your Worth (MSOYW) is an 8 week program that is designed for any individual desiring to obtain positive self-worth or secure attachment. Participants will go through a series of sessions in a group format designed to help them understand how the events in their lives have contributed to low self-worth. These sessions focus on rebuilding a new life based on positive self-worth as well as how to maintain these gains. Our next women's class starts on January 5, 2025.

<u>Grands Raising Greats - (GRG)</u> is a welcoming space for grandparents and non-relative caregivers who are caring for children the second time around. It's a time for connection, camaraderie, and sharing among fellow "Grands" who are raising "Great" kids! Our next luncheon is Tuesday, January 14, 2025, at noon.

Sunshine Health Care Grant

Sunshine Health offers an additional benefit to support services or supplies for each member. The Care Grant is a fund that can be utilized for activities that support social, physical, and educational development of the member and are not Medicaid covered benefits.

CARE GRANT ELIGIBILITY & CRITERIA

- •Is enrolled in the Sunshine Health Child Welfare Specialty Plan at the time of request.
- •Service or supply must be used for the member directly.
- •Care Grant funding is \$150 per member per calendar year.
- •Care Grant funds not used within one (1) calendar year cannot be carried over to the next calendar year.

REQUEST PROCEDURE

Requests for Care Grant applications and completed applications must be submitted to **both** HFC Nurse Care Specialists, Deborah Caufman, <u>dcaufman@heartlandforchildren.org</u> and Maria Castro, <u>mcastro4@heartlandforchildren.org</u>.

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Supporting documentation describing services and/or supplies, along with verification of cost, must be submitted at the time of initial request. Examples of supporting documentation are receipts, printouts of cost from websites, flyers from school or other programs, or written estimate of services to be provided. Documentation should clearly demonstrate the cost of the services or supplies to be equal to the amount requested.

EXAMPLES OF EDUCATIONAL, SOCIAL OR PHYSICAL SUPPLIES OR SERVICES

Activity or Registration Fees For: Camp, Daycare, Sports Clubs, Dance Lessons, Tutoring, Field Trips

Supplies: Football Uniforms, Cheerleading Uniforms, Musical Instrument Rental, Sporting Goods

Items that do not meet criteria and will not be approved:

- •Electronics: Kindle Fire, Cell Phones, Gaming Systems, iPads
- •General clothing Items: School Uniforms, General Clothing Items not associated with an activity
- Medical equipment, car seats, strollers, or diapers


